This calendar was set up so you could write notes, draw pictures or tape photos to the left side.

Provided credit is given to the Michigan Artist Blacksmiths Association, permission is granted to reprint this calendar and the hanger project for NON PROFIT purposes.



The pages were set up to print on one side as most home printers do not duplex, and it needs to be 3-hole punched to hang on 3 hooks. It works fine on 28 lb. stock, we like it better printed on 65 lb. card stock.

I have also put up a copy of the calendar that is blank on the left side. You could print that calendar for those not-so-interested in blacksmithing. The blank area could be used for notes or have your kids draw pictures for you.

Many computer print project programs can “make a calendar” so you would be able to generate a calendar of your own in the future.

The calendar hanger is a simplified key rack. Most usually hang from 2 nails, but this is light enough to hang from one. The placement of the hooks needs to match your 3-hole punch.
