monthly educational demonstrations at blacksmith shops around the state from October through May. These are conducted by experienced members interested in sharing their talents. Before and after the demonstrations there is plenty of time to talk with members who are always ready to share their interest and knowledge in blacksmithing.

During the summer months members enjoy demonstrating at reenactments, art fairs, crafts fairs and historic sites.

Members receive our newsletter, The Upsetter, four to six times a year. Articles containing demonstration information, projects of varied skill level, tool projects, book reviews, information on association or member activities, safety items and a wide variety of articles from the ABANA affiliate newsletter exchange program.
